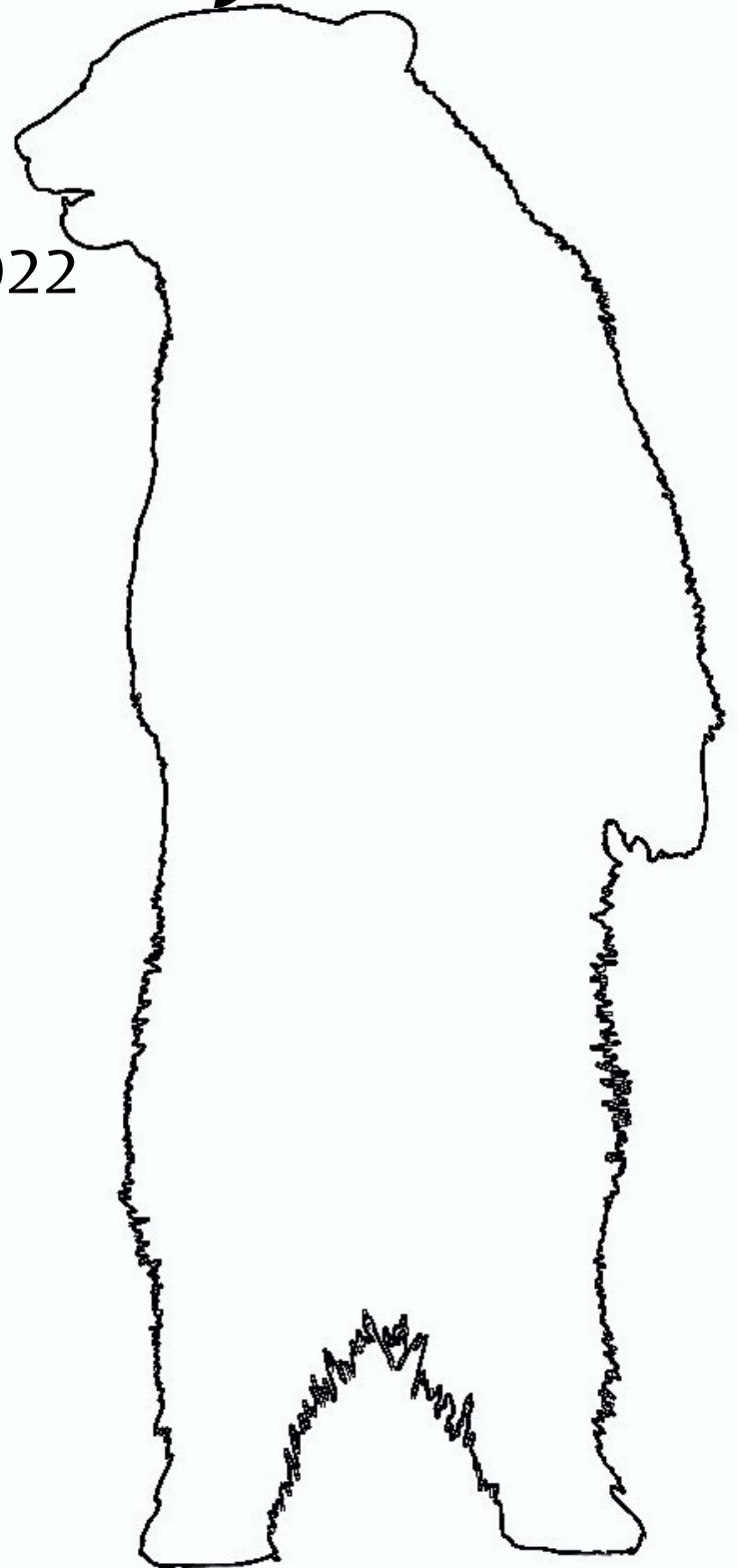

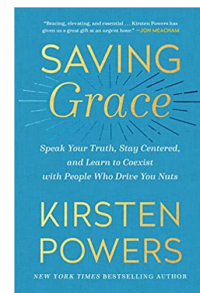
"MENDING CHURCH" BANNER PROJECT
